I can't believe that we have come through the Lenten season and now find ourselves in the midst of Easter. Yes, Easter is a season, not just one day. It is known as Eastertide and will end of Pentecost Sunday, June the 4th. As I have alluded to over the last several weeks, I do hope that you were able, during the Lenten season, to make some new commitments and to think about ways that you can grow as a disciple of Jesus Christ. But if you didn't, it is never too late to start.

If you are like me, you probably have a tendency sometimes to put things off till tomorrow. But, if you are like me, you have also discovered that the more you put things off, the less chance you have of ever doing them. So, even though Lent is over, it is not too late to either take on or give up something that will help you be a better Christian. Perhaps one of the things we can all do is reflect on how fear can get in the way of our ministry. Last week, we started a new sermon series dealing with some of the fears that do that very thing. Last week we looked at the fear of rejection; this week we will discuss the fear failure, and next week the fear of the future, which can include the fear of death. As I said last week, there is a normal element of fear that comes with being human;

but when fear becomes the consuming aspect of our life, it can cause all kinds of problems.

I hope you will make an effort to be present for these sermons, and I hope you will make an effort to be present in worship moving forward as we being the summer. Traditionally, in every congregation that I have been a part of, as a member or as a pastor, there has been a drop-off in attendance. And that makes sense. The weather is warmer, the children are out of school, and it is the vacation time of year. But I want to encourage you not to just take the summer off from church. When you think about three months, and the way not being involved in church for three months can affect your spiritual life, it becomes apparent that being gone all summer can make a difference. So, stay connected, stay involved and stay in touch.


